At the ACLU-NJ, law students have the opportunity to contribute to a broad range of cutting-edge civil rights and liberties work. Students work closely with the legal and policy staff to conduct legal research, write legal memoranda, draft correspondence to government agencies, learn legislative advocacy techniques, and analyze pending state and local legislative proposals that impact civil rights and liberties in New Jersey.

Prerequisites include: academic standing as a 1L, 2L, 2L part-time or 3L part-time law student; a commitment to civil liberties and civil rights; good interpersonal and analytical skills; the ability to write in a clear and concise manner; and a commitment to racial justice, diversity, equity, and inclusion in the workplace.
