Conduct telephone interviews with clients; prepare intake forms; provide assessment of cases for attorneys Legal research and writing

Support policy advocacy and legal reform and education initiatives

Assist attorneys (in court and out of court) in Final Restraining Order hearings, non-dissolution hearings, motions and orders to show cause.

Participate at trials and/or hearings pursuant to New Jersey Court Rule 1:21-3(b) allowing students who have completed two years of law school to appear in court. (Rising 3L students only)

Assist clients in preparing court papers for pro se representation.

Attend events in conjunction with the internship; some evenings may be required

Submit an end-of-internship report at the conclusion of the program
