Applied Legal Analysis – Asynchronous; one synchronous class on Tuesday, Jan, 5<sup>th</sup> 1:00-2:15. This is a 2 non-credit course. Pass/Fail.

Baseball Arbitration is only open to students who have successfully completed Contracts. Students wishing to participate in the Spring New Orleans Baseball Arbitration Competition (601-575-01) must enroll in this course, which will be used to select the team of competitors.

**Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> – January 1<sup>st</sup>: Open time period. Two-hour online introduction you must watch and complete a few short questions to ensure completion.**

Synchronous zoom sessions; asynchronous lectures; team/partner workshops with instructor through zoom.

Saturday, Jan. 9<sup>th</sup> – 10:00-3:00 for arbitrations. (If cannot do Saturday for religious reasons; will schedule on another date).

**\* Students only need to attend one of the two sessions scheduled on Wednesday, January 6<sup>th</sup>.**

E - Interviewing & Counseling - Students who complete this course may not enroll in Interviewing, Counseling and Negotiation.

Interviewing & Counseling will be half synchronous, half asynchronous (asynchronous hours include approximately 5 hours of simulations and debriefs with professor and other members of the class, so some scheduling flexibility is necessary). Plan to work on final writing assignments over the weekend of January 9-10. Fairly reliable internet connection is necessary for this course.
