#### **EXCLUSIONS:**

**Hunter Moot Court:** Students who take Hunter Moot Court may not also take Persuasion in Legal Writing. Students who have had Persuasion in Legal Writing may take Hunter Moot Court, but will earn only one (1) graded credit in the fall semester (and two credits in the spring semester).

**Room Locations:** Room numbers beginning with E are in the East building. Room E107 is the Moot Court Room. Room E107-A is the Jury Room.

Advanced Evidence (Lore) – Intensive course – will meet Friday, February 2, Saturday, February 3 and Sunday, February 4 from 9:00-1:00; Friday, February 9 and Saturday, February 10 from 9:00-1:00; and Sunday, February 11 from 9:00-3:00.

Business Torts Lab does not meet every week, though students need to be available every week.

Criminal Practice (Cipparone) – It is strongly recommended that students take Trial Advocacy before or in conjunction with this course.

Cuba Legal Field Study – will meet on the following Saturdays: January 13, 20, 27; February 3, 10, 17, 24; March 3, 24 and March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018. Students taking this course must travel to Cuba during the 2018 Spring Break.
