

RUTGERS SCHOOL OF LAW – FALL 2011 EXAMINATION SCHEDULE

Advisory Notice: Rutgers Law School publishes in advance a final examination schedule which is not subject to change **after the advance registration period is completed.** Courses are scheduled at the law school so that students may not select course loads with conflicting examinations (i.e., exams which occur simultaneously); however, it is ultimately the student's responsibility to ensure that exams do not conflict. In addition, first-year examinations are scheduled to equalize the intervals between tests and, when possible, to provide a break between upperclass examinations. Students are urged not to construct a course load which produces unduly burdensome examination requirements. Rutgers School of Law-Camden does not grant deferments because a student has selected an over-taxing examination schedule.

Note: Please check the Exam Administration Questionnaire when it is posted prior to the exam period. In the event of a discrepancy, please follow the Exam Administration Questionnaire. (Faculty occasionally opt to be more lenient about self-scheduling than is initially set forth in this schedule.)
