Intramural Mock Trial Board - Students receive one credit in the Fall and one credit I the Spring, pursuant to Academic Rules 8.5(a) and (b).

Marshall Brennan Program - some additional class time will be required.

Preparing for Practice-Advanced Professionalism: class meets for 50 minutes each session.

Sexual Violence & Social Change: Bolivia - Meets last 5 Saturdays of the semester, March 28 to April 25. This course includes a travel component to Bolivia in August, 2015.

Trial Advocacy §11 will have one Saturday meeting TBD.

Unemployment and the Law is cross-listed and begins Monday, January 26; ending April 27, 2015.

I = INTENSIVE COURSES:

Advanced Legal Research-Special Topics - meets intensively for 7 weeks on Wednesdays, beginning Jan 14 through February 25, 2015.

Evidence II - meets intensively for 9 weeks on Wednesday evenings, beginning January 14; ending March 11, 2015.

Sexual Violence & Social Change: Bolivia - Meets last 5 Saturdays of the semester, March 28 to April 25. This course includes a travel component to Bolivia in August, 2015.

EXCLUSIONS:

Hunter Moot Court: Students who take Hunter Moot Court may not also take Persuasion in Legal Writing. Students who have had Persuasion in Legal Writing may take Hunter Moot Court, but will earn only one (1) graded credit in the fall semester (and two credits in the spring semester).

DL = Distance Learning:

ABA rules limit students to only 15 credits of Distance Learning toward the 84 credits needed for the JD degree.

Federal Jurisdiction is being taught in our new immersive classroom, Room 323 ("The Holodeck"), by Dean Ron Chen from Rutgers Law-Newark.

Foreign Relations & National Security is also being taught in the new classroom by Prof. Beth Stephens (teaching from Newark).

International Environmental Law (Prof. Cymie Payne) will be offered in Room E-320 via DL.

NJ Practice (Prof. Kenny, teaching from Newark), in our new immersive classroom, Room 323.

Intro to UCC (Prof. Dennis Patterson) is an **asynchronous** distance learning class. If you are considering practicing in New York, you should complete two additional credits before graduating (for a total of 86) because New York will not recognize asynchronous course work.

Under our current rules, and those of the ABA, credits earned in these courses count towards the maximum limits on distance learning. **You may not take more than one DL class per semester.**

Child Migration & U.S. Immigration (Profs. Gottesman and Mandelbaum), and South African Constitutional Law (Prof. Mutcherson) are also being taught in the Holodeck, but are not DL courses for Camden students.

Room Locations: Room numbers beginning with E are in the East building. Room E107 is the Moot Court Room. Room E107-A is the Jury Room.
